It's all a part of the Maker's plan,

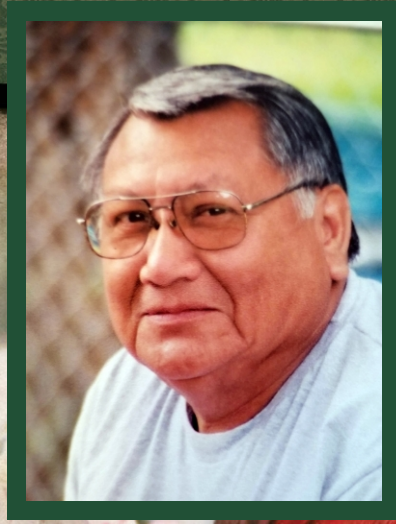

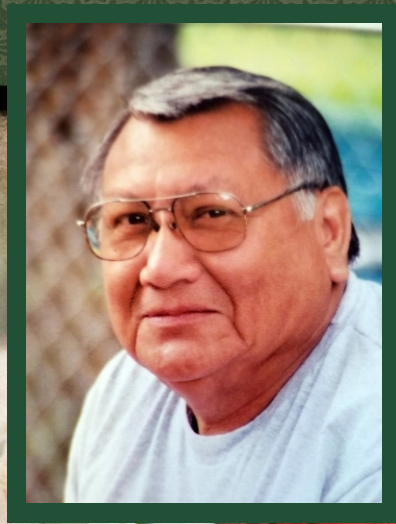
