
The Moment That You Left Me,



Warren quietly became one of the best basketball players in a class that gave basketball credibility to the University of Tulsa. Warren was chosen 43rd overall in the NBA Draft in 1953. But Warren did not seek publicity and had no illusions about an NBA career. He graduated from TU, and then married the love of his life Patricia Ann Triplett on March 27, 1954. It was then that Warren was drafted in the United States Army. Warren proudly served his country and was a member of the All Army Basketball Team stationed at Ft. Chaffee, Arkansas from 1954-1956. Warren was a career high school coach, teacher and administrator for Jay Public Schools for 32 years. He was inducted into the Oklahoma Coaches Hall of Fame and the University of Tulsa's Athletic Hall of Fame. He was an Elder of the Southside Church of Christ in Jay for over 40 years. Warren was also a member of the Whispering Hills Church of Christ in Broken Arrow.
