you fought so hard to stay.

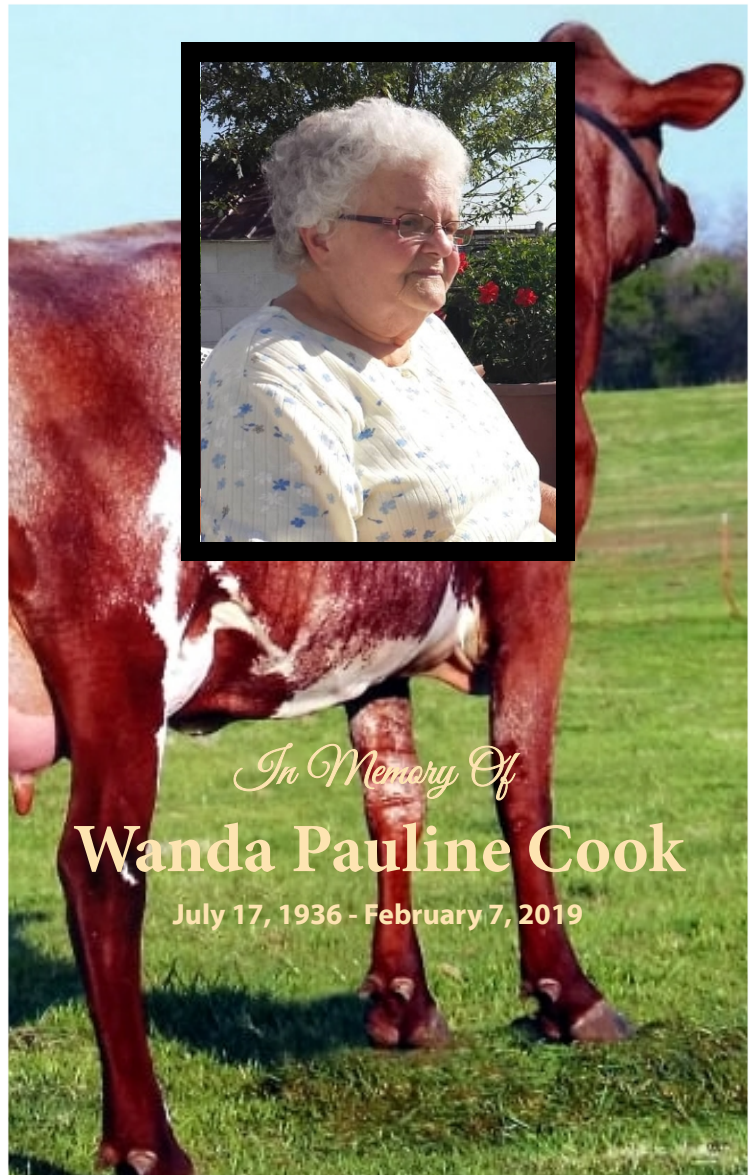
But when we saw you sleeping

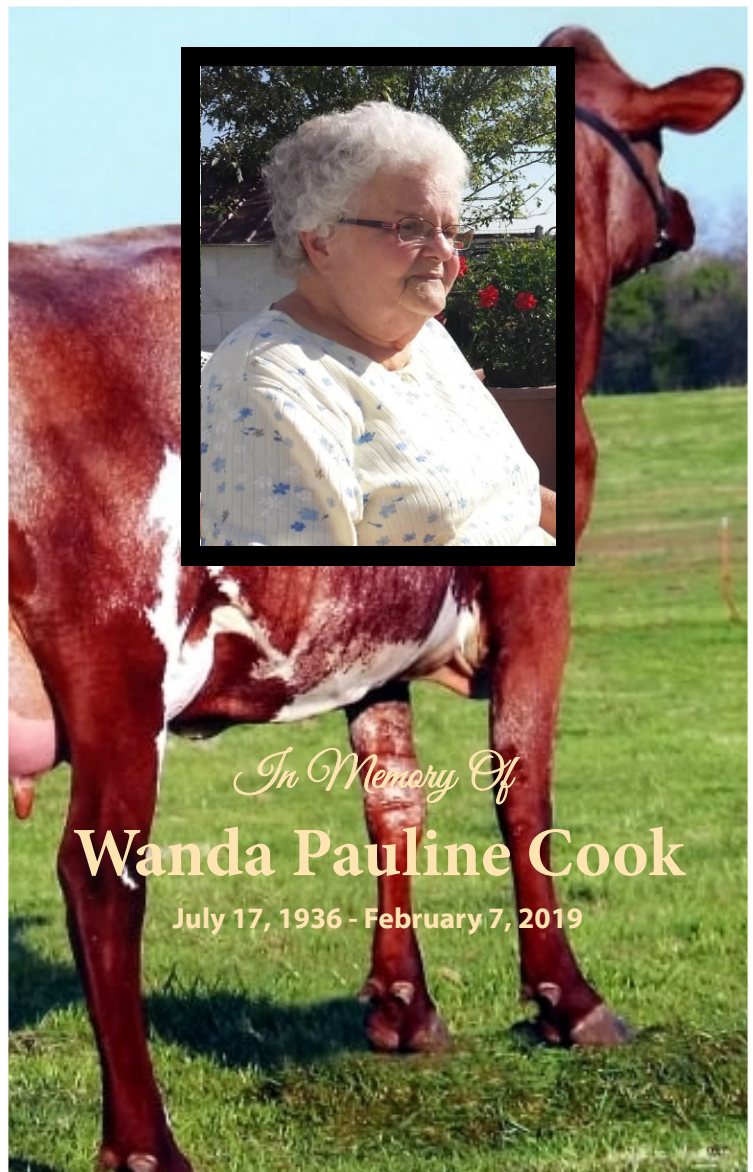
